Your kindness provided a special meal of biryani, chicken curry, vegetable dishes and sweets for all the residents. There was a Christmas message and prayers of thanksgiving.

A 'bundle of love' was gratefully received by everyone. Each parcel contained gifts of a saree or shirt and trousers, a woollen blanket, a special comb with a handle for people with disabled hands, Vaseline to keep skin supple, socks and coconut oil.

Your wonderful compassion also funded food parcels for the elderly and disabled. They were delighted with the rice, dal, oil, pulses and soap. For people who are unwanted and often shunned, showing them that they are loved and valued really makes a difference to how they see themselves.
